On this occasion it was possible to check moorings whilst there was a group to supervise and provide advice / safety cover. Members were able to clear much of the top part of the ford. It is hard to believe how much the creek is silting. The mud was once at the same height as the ford. Attempts have been made over the years to stem the advancing ooze. Archaeologists may wonder over the plastic barrels either side, long since covered. Perhaps the new channels formed in the mud may change the rate of deposition.

There was much strimming and mowing done around the shed site and it is looking much better. There are always tools kept in the shed if you are at a loose end over the summer.
