Shed news

As we approach laying up time, space in the main area of the sheds will be required for winter storage. It is customary for tenders to be stored in the main shed over the summer for ease of access. However, to free up space, owners who wish to keep their tenders on site should move them outside or into the dinghy store. In preparation for hauling out, please ensure that trailers are serviced ahead of time to ensure smooth and safe recovery. Once recovered boats should remain movable if required.

Please be aware that boats which have not been used for some time and are not being actively worked on may be moved from their current location to maximise accessibility and storage opportunities for active users of the site.

Moorings

Please take the opportunity to service your moorings over the winter. Especially if remaining afloat. If you intend to replace mooring tackle it is a good idea to start early and let the sinkers bed in over the winter. A lot of wear occurs to mooring chain as the tide rises and falls. Consider removing the mooring buoys over the winter and replacing them with a rope riser and a small float, the chain stays on the mud, the small float helps to find it again in the spring.
