I tend to hang the lock on the inside hook so I don't take it home by accident when there are others working in the shed.

We are in the process of writing to owners who have boats at the sheds which are unlikely to see the water again and whose boats or trailers are becoming unsafe. It is part of the storage policy that boats should be movable if required.

Finally, a big thank you to those who have been down and moved their dinghies into the central store or outside, to make room for winter storage.
